Thoughts from Rev. John McNaughton

As an old paratrooper, I have long admired courage and compassion as the greatest qualities of human character. In recent months they shone out in the midst of the appalling events which took place in the Manchester Arena, at Westminster Bridge, London Bridge, and the Grenfell Tower inferno.

Those events brought massive loss of life and dreadful injuries to ordinary folk like ourselves. All our hearts went out to the afflicted and bereaved, creating the "sombre mood" described by Her Majesty the Queen in the unusually restrained Ceremonial State Opening of Parliament in June.

Modest people that we are, it took some time for accounts of heroism to emerge. Slowly we learned of sacrifices made, of risks taken, of generosity given, and our hearts were uplifted as we learned more and more of the courage and compassion shown by so many in dignified human character. Unfortunately the "sombre mood" across the nation recognised that such dignity is not universal.

In that same speech in Parliament, her Majesty referred to the problem of "domestic violence". It shows that in the midst of all our advances in this 21st Century we still need to advance in character. In fact, isn't that true of all of us all the time?

Our character can grow all along our road of life. A wrong turning can be disastrous. I can't forget Ian Brady, the moors murderer, the avowed atheist, who spoke of his killing of children as "existential exercises." How much happier life would have been for many if, at some crossroad in his life, he had met a christian who could have put him on the road to truth and new life. There is still an urgent need for prayerful christians in this 21st century. It could be you!
