Thoughts from Rev. John McNaughton

On two Sundays this month, an atheist will feature prominently in the mind of the Nation. Naturally he will not be celebrated as a Saint! A hundred years ago, in the first World War, he was serving in the German Army as Corporal Shicklegruber. Defeat had such a profound effect upon him that he was later described by Winston Churchill as "that abortion of evil and defeat."

Unfortunately, atheism demands intellectual arrogance for no one can prove that God does not exist. Shicklegruber showed his arrogance in a perverted attempt to rule the world. He abandoned the ancient religion of atheism by developing his own theory of a "Master Race" which would rule the world. As the head of that race, he would become a kind of God on earth under the new name of Adolf Hitler.

He will be remembered on Sunday 3rd September, for it was on Sunday 3rd September 1939 at 11-00 a.m. that we found ourselves at war with Germany. As we all know, that second World War would take an appalling toll of lives and resources.
