Thoughts from Rev. John McNaughton

As I have written before: Inspiration must be better than regulation. Regulations can sometimes be somewhat crushing, whereas inspiration lifts us above ourselves, and brightens our lives. Interestingly Spring sunshine, with lengthening daylight hours, gives rise to the name of Lent in our Church Calendar.

It is a good time to let a little light shine into our lives at that most important feature which is growing all the time: our character. For most of us there are a few dark corners that need brightening up so that we can bring a little light into the lives of others. For centuries it has been recognised as a time for

brightening up our friendship with Christ, the light of the world.

Thankfully it led to the development of the Christian civilisation which you and I have enjoyed. Sadly, there appear to be more and more people who are sincerely worried for members of a younger

generation. They are concerned with what they see as a lowering of standards in our relationships with one another, not only in our honesty and integrity but in our concern for one another, even in family life where breakdowns are detrimental to the lives of children.
