Thoughts from Rev. John McNaughton

My dear Friends,

I can only write a humble and totally inadequate “thank you” for all the prayer, care, helpfulness and loving kindness which has surrounded me following the sudden death of Morag on 10th January. She will always be very close to me, and I believe it is only right that I should express her gratitude as well.

I have always been deeply grateful (and not a little amazed!) that she was prepared to share her life with a chap like me. A brave old veteran of the First World War Royal Flying Corps conducted our Marriage Service. He went on to admire Morag’s consistent courage, love and loyalty in marrying a paratrooper.

The last big event which I shared with Morag, only weeks before she died, was a special service in Aldershot

Garrison Church where those of us who got home from a tricky operational tour remembered our chums who did not get home. It was a moving and memorable occasion.

Right now, emotion is raw and very near the surface. You will understand how much it means that these words are written beneath a little programme outlining the most important events in all human history: Christ, Son of God our Father, offering new life to us all in sacred bread and wine as he prepared for his cruel public death; his

sacrifice on the Cross, assuring divine forgiveness to all who seek it in genuine repentance; and wonderfully demonstrating by his resurrection that death is a threshold into new life.

The diocesan faculty (permission for works to be undertaken) for the further investigatory works, to which I referred in an earlier Newsletter, has been granted.
