

When is Mother's Day 2020?

This year, Mother's Day will fall on Sunday March 22 - the fourth Sunday in Lent. It also falls exactly three weeks before Easter Sunday, which is on April 12 this year.

What are the origins of Mother's Day? The origins of Mothering Sunday in the UK begin in the Middle Ages, when children who had left their families to work in domestic service were allowed to go back to their home church - or "mother church" as it was known. At first, the "mothering" aspect of the day had no link to maternal parents, as it does today. The journey home also morphed into a spring occasion for families to reunite. The custom then developed for children to pick flowers on the way home as a gift to their mothers. The date also became a celebration as the fasting rules of Lent were relaxed to allow revellers a long-awaited feast. So it also became known as Refreshment Sunday, Simnel Sunday - after the simnel cakes traditionally baked on the day - and, to some, Pudding Pie Sunday.
